The first ‘Interactive Session’ was presided over by Dr. Mukta Mishra on the topic:’ **VISIBLE THINKING**’ on May 26, 2021 and she apprised about the effects of your thinking or goals when you made them visible to the society. She also touched upon the future of education and how the technology will change the teaching-learning process.

- ❖ With an example of a psychological experiment undertaken by Stanford University by the psychologist name Zimbardo in 1971. The experiment was regarding the human behaviour when confined or trapped in closed doors. With the help of a small

video clip about psychological experiment she explained that our environment instigates us to adopt the behavior best suited for the situation. She further engaged the attendees in engaging activities.

- ❖ She expressed that technology is going to bring a big change in our teaching process and how by using tools like word cloud, paddlet and Menti Meter we can engage students in various activities.
- ❖ She said although we are not using these teaching aids right now but soon they will become the part n parcel of the teaching-learning process.
- ❖ She reiterated that handholding of technology and keeping pace with the latest tech trends is vital otherwise we will not be able to cope up with the demands of the new age world.
- ❖ From 5-6 years down the line we would witness a sea change in the teaching-learning process. There would be no books to teach from rather we would be having either recorded lectures, power point presentations. So we cannot wait for that process to start.
- ❖ The face of education will be completely changed so we cannot sit or wait for the time to unfold but, we

are required to prepare ourselves today so that we can take the future challenges head on.

- ❖ Gradually we need to adopt the Global Design of Learning and make our future goals visible right from students to teachers, to higher authorities to community and together we need to create a learning environment which fits in Global Design of Learning.
